We have here a collection of Maori songs by several Maori Composers. Three of these are by KINGI TAHIRI of the Ngati Huiarau tribe.

The four Huiarau sisters had a duty to their parents and, in particular, to their father who took a deep interest in Maori music and the training of his daughters' voices. This is what motivated these essentially individualistic sisters into collaborating their vocal efforts in the belief that they had something worthwhile to offer Maori music.

KAY who sings lead in all the songs, has a particularly outstanding voice and is a versatile singer. Her rendering of "Now Is The Hour" with her sisters, touches one to the very soul.

KELLY, the soloist in most of the songs, as well as her ethnic technique, has a deep vibrant quality which brings colour to the different presentations.

LAURA, the youngest of the group, has the soft deep voice so necessary to this type of harmony.

HINERANGI, the eldest of the sisters, composes and arranges many of the songs used by the Quartet, with the idea of encouraging the Maori people to use their natural talents in this field.

And so we greet and honour you, Te Ata
As you stand upon Turlangawawee
Your ancestral marae.

2. **KAMARANGI TE WAI** -
Soloists: Hinerangi and Kelly
Composer: Kingi Tahiri
"Hearken unto me
All you that mourn!
Enhance the status
Of the Maori people.
Raise it ever so high.
It is not a taia
For the weak (lairy people)."

3. **TU MOKE MOKE** - Soloists: Laura and Kelly -
Original.
"Your marae stands alone
Deserted and forlorn.
In vain we look
Asking in vain
Where?
You have departed
Leaving your people
Alas! the gnawing pain."

4. **ETE IWI E.** - Composer: Kingi Tahiri
A Call to the people to hold fast to their traditions.

5. **TE MARAMA ITE PO** - Soloist: Kelly - Original.
"The moon is high,
The stars are a-gleam
When you awake my love
You were startled."

6. **PATERE "TAIARU"** - Composer: Hinerangi
The theme is the Great Fleet with particular emphasis on the Tainui Canoe.

7. **REO KARERE** - Composer: Hinerangi
Composed as a tribute to the passing of their uncle,
Charles Rewell, a chief of the Maniapoto Tribe.
He devoted his life to his people.

Modern action song.

2. **MANU RENE** - TE OPE TUATAHI - Traditional
Two action songs.

3. **TUREITI ETE IWI** - Original
"My people listen
Your words of denial
Are to no avail -

4. **TIARO TANUMIA** -
Rarotongan Folk Song.

5. **HINEMOA** - Soloist: Hinerangi - Composer:
Kingi Tahiri.
"There is no woman
To liken Hinemoa
She who fulfilled
Her desire to the end."

6. **KAREWA** - Soloist: Kelly - Original
"Hauahu you here my people
Fare you well
And rest upon this
Waikato proverb:
"On every bend (of the Waikato River) stands a chief
A land mark
A wise people.
Enough!"

"We shall return
With devotion for all
To the land of Aotearoa
To the people of Kiwhia
With our love
This is the deeply hallowed ancestral altar
This is Karewa.
Already out at sea, I returned
To the resting place of Tainui."

7. **FAREWELL TO WANA-I-RANGI** (Lament) -
Soloist: Kelly - Composer: Hinerangi.
This Song is dedicated to Wana-i-rangi Toka of the
Ngati Ruahiri and Maniapoto Tribes, cousin of the
singers and an expert in all forms of Maori Art.

8. **NOW IS THE HOUR** (PO ATA HAU) - Soloist: Kay


