Regional Round Up Whitireia Park Restoration Group **Titahi Bay, Porirua**



Porirua is 20 mins north of Wellington

Whitireia Park is on the southern headland of Te Awarua-o-Porirua (Porirua harbours – Onepoto arm and Pauatahanui Inlet) Covers 180 hectares of grassland with substantial areas of gorse



Highly modified but has a range of habitats all strongly influenced by salt wind

Coastal escarpment is between 20 and 60 metres above sea level Two sites of *Leptinella nana* (Nationally critical) 300 metres apart in different habitats



Site 1 is gentle slope partly very exposed to sun and wind Surrounded by pasture grass and tauhinu (*Ozothamnus leptophyllus*) Photo 2006

Area – site 1

- Originally 1 tiny area around 20 x15 cm
- Currently 4 areas within the site ranging from 600 x
 350cm to 15 x 15cm

Site limitations

- Lack of dappled shade
- Drought
- Competition from exotic and native species *Muehlenbeckia complexa Coprosma propinqua Phormium tenax* (planted by guerilla gardener) Pasture grass



Vegetative dessication from lack of water



Dessicated vegetation area following watering

Site 1 potential

- Unlimited area to spread if.....
 - some species are controlled
 - Surrounding area is planted
 - water during dry periods





Site 2 is in a steep sided valley sheltered, moister and more shaded Surrounding vegetation mānuka, tauhinu, *Olearia solandri* and gorse



Site 2 lower site

Area – site 2

- Originally 1 tiny area around 15 x 10 cm
- Currently 3 areas within the site ranging from 300 x 200cm to 10 x 10cm

Site limitations

- Succession and competition of native species
 Dichondra repens
 Oxalis exilis
 Poa cita
 Luzula banksiana
 Multiple native shrub seedlings – mānuka, tauhinu
- Lack of areas to spread to due to density of vegetation



Site 2 potential

- Remove kikuyu, gorse and boneseed from gully above site 2.
- Progressively plant grey scrub tauhinu, *Olearia solandri*, matagouri, and *Muehlenbeckia astonii* to create the right conditions
- Monitor using mātauranga (adaptive management)

Site 1 and 2 Continue weeding both sites Hand water during drought Raise the profile of the little things.....
