



1869 The west bank of 'Nga Wai Weherua,' where Kiwa settled generations earlier















"Some four thousand acres of bush country were cleared in the Waimata district yesterday, a good burn being obtained" [1895]


The plumes of smoke rose so high that people out at sea thought that a volcano had erupted in land. The lights had to be turned off in the offices in town.

1876, 1880, 1892, 1894, 1902, 1910 MAJOR FLOODS ON THE RIVERS

At times of heavy rainfall, the exposed mudstone hillsides slid and slipped, blocking the river.

When these dams burst, they released surging waves downstream, eroding river banks, destroying bridges, choking the estuary with sediment and covering the beaches with logs





WAIMATA'S "LITTLE ROTORUA"

On Mr Stan Jones's Kaharoa Station in the Waimata Valley near Gisborne there is a small area which has all the trademarks of Rotorua except two. The exceptions: there's no steam, and no smell.

For the rest, the scene is quito thermal. There are "boiling" mudpools and little "crater" mountains. The "plop" of the mud "boiling" can be heard long before the scene is reached.




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



1920s THE RIVER WAS SPLIT FROM THE PORT, POHO-O-RAWIRI WAS SHIFTED INLAND, MAJOR RECLAMATIONS BURIED THE ROCKY REEF


Athough 'the Cut' was completed in 1931, the river continued to flood, in 1938 and 1944, for instance, when a large flood swept trees downstream, damaging the William Petty bridge.

There were more major floods in 1948, 1950, 1955, 1958, 1968, 1971 and 1981.


There were more logs on the beaches and the harbour had to be dredged

Waimata Slip

A new road over the Waimata slip, on the Riverside Road, which had been considered to be too unstable for work to be done on it for some considerable time, was in use only two or three weeks after the disaster which wrecked a quarter-mile of road early in August. A track over the slip was started by Cook County staff to help a farmer get his cream out. Then Mr.R. F.Holden, of Rimuros Station, put two bulldozers to work. Soon a fairly good road had been built, and the adjacent slopes planted with saplings.
